Seth Moyse is a retired social worker who has been on the Board of Directors of Community Living Welland Pelham for the past ten years and previously served as this agency's Executive Director during the 1990's. For over 50 years, Seth has worked in various roles, alongside individuals who have a developmental disability in community-based settings, as well as with individuals experiencing acute or persistent mental health challenges in inpatient and outpatient settings. In 1979, Seth was introduced to Normalization, now known as Social Role Valorization (SRV), and its teachings continue to have a profound impact on how he sees the world and the people in it. As a board member, Seth actively seeks out ongoing SRV training and firmly believes that the Board has a critical role to play in nurturing and sustaining SRV principles.

Music has always played a significant role in Seth's life, both personally and professionally. He currently plays in a number of groups and has the privilege of serving as a cantor in his church.

Leslie Monger

Executive Director, Community Living Welland Pelham

Leslie Monger is the Executive Director of Community Living Welland Pelham, with a 39-year tenure at the agency. Leslie's career began at Westwood Residence, a 28-bed facility for adults with intellectual disabilities. Following the facility's closure, she gained extensive experience in group homes, supported independent living, and family homes.

Leslie served as Supervisor of Independent Living and Family Homes for 15 years, supporting over 90 individuals, then as Director of Adult Services for a decade before assuming the role of Executive Director in May 2024. She is an active member of the SRV Study Group and continues to seek knowledge and attend SRV training.
